A reflection on this week's readings

From the readings for Sunday 5th May

John 15:12-17

This is my commandment, That ye love one another, as I have loved you. Greater love hath no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends. Ye are my friends, if ye do whatsoever I command you. Henceforth I call you not servants; for the servant knoweth not what his lord doeth: but I have called you friends; for all things that I have heard of my Father I have made known unto you. Ye have not chosen me, but I have chosen you, and ordained you, that ye should go and bring forth fruit, and that your fruit should remain: that whatsoever ye shall ask of the Father in my name, he may give it you. These things I command you, that ye love one another.

AV (King James Bible)

This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. Greater love has no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you. No longer do I call you servants, for the servant does not know what his master is doing; but I have called you friends, for all that I have heard from my Father I have made known to you. You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit and that your fruit should abide; so that whatever you ask the Father in my name, he may give it to you. This I command you, to love one another.

RSV

This is my commandment: that you love each other as I have loved you. There is no greater love than this—that a man should lay down his life for his friends. You are my friends if you do what I tell you to do. I shall not call you servants any longer, for a servant does not share his master's confidence. No, I call you friends, now, because I have told you everything that I have heard from the Father. It is not that you have chosen me; but it is I who have chosen you. I have appointed you to go and bear fruit that will be lasting; so that whatever you ask the Father in my name, he will give it to you. This I command you, love one another!

J B Phillips

This is my command: Love one another the way I loved you. This is the very best way to love. Put your life on the line for your friends. You are my friends when you do the things I command you. I'm no longer calling you servants because servants don't understand what their master is thinking and planning. No, I've named you friends because I've let you in on everything I've heard from the Father. You didn't choose me, remember; I chose you, and put you in the world to bear fruit, fruit that won't spoil. As fruit bearers, whatever you ask the Father in relation to me, he gives you. But remember the root command: Love one another.

The Message

Today's reading follows on directly from last week's – all part of Jesus' long series of discourses to his disciples at the Last Supper. For this gospel writer, at this supreme moment, it's more important to get his vital and complex theological message across than to portray a credible conversation around the dinner table! (Here too, the contrast with the other gospels is very marked.)

Again the style is solemn and emphatic; Jesus is giving himself – and us – time to make sure the message sinks in. He brilliantly uses the technique of *repetition with variation* to reinforce a previous point while pushing the argument forward, keeping us alert for new ideas but at the same time secure in the overall direction. As in a piece of classical music, a previously heard theme briefly resurfaces to make the connection between what has gone before and what we're hearing now. The reference to bearing fruit in v.16 reminds us of all the implications of "I am the vine and you are the branches" which we heard last week.

A paradox here: We're free, friends not servants but at the same time, even if on one level we've chosen to be disciples of Christ, fundamentally he has chosen us and we need constantly and prayerfully to ask ourselves – and the Holy Spirit who dwells within us – what we've been chosen for.

Again these are passages which lend themselves to the slow and repeated reading of short extracts – maybe just a couple of verses at a time – to let the deep meaning sink in, and comfort, challenge or stimulate us.
